





Gospel Aleditation

August 11, 2024 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we hear Jesus say, "He that believes in me, has eternal life" (John 6:47). These straightforward words, uttered by human lips, sound — how to put this? — insane. Who could possibly say such a thing? Jesus says things that are so high, so demanding, so beyond our capacity to fathom, we hardly know what to do with them and (if you're like me), they usually go in one ear and out the other. So, let us ask: how can believing in him lead to eternal life?

To believe in something means not just to acknowledge its existence, but also to orient yourself entirely to it. If a football player believes in his team, it means he puts his life totally at the service of that goal. If a student believes in her dream to become a doctor, she gives everything she has to her studies and preparation for her MCAT test. Belief means to move boldly toward something we love, and trust is possible to attain.

What is the highest possible good at which we can aim? It is God himself, the gift of eternal life without end. Jesus has made this "good" possible in and through his human nature. To believe in him means to have him as our ultimate goal. This week let's believe the truth of these words and make practical decisions to orient ourselves toward what we see available in him: eternal life.





After My Own Heart

From Man to Christian to Priest by Michael Salemi, Seminarian

Part 9 - Farewell: Now, It Is Your Turn

"Do you resolve to be united more closely every day to Christ the High Priest, who offered himself for us to the Father as a pure Sacrifice, and with him to consecrate yourself to God for the salvation of all?"

— "I do, with the help of God."


(From the Promises of the Clect for Priestly Ordination)

This has been quite the journey: Propaedeutic, Discipleship, Configuration, and Synthesis; Human, Spiritual, Intellectual, and Pastoral. The spiritual temple built over the stages of formation is hopefully completed by the time of ordination, so that the special graces of diaconate and priesthood given by the Holy Spirit may have a suitable dwelling place. However, this temple needs constant maintenance and renovation throughout the life of the priest. Our formation does not end upon ordination. It ends with death. If the four pillars are not constantly cared for, this temple will be in danger of collapse. If a priest finds himself completely content with his spiritual life and does not seek to progress further, then he has endangered his priesthood. The same is true for you.

Every one of you at Baptism receives a three-fold anointing with the sacred chrism. You are anointed as a **priest**, as a **prophet**, and as a **king**. While you are not able to offer the Sacrifice of the Mass or other sacraments, your priesthood allows you to directly offer things to God. You have an office of sanctifying things directly under your control, such as your lifestyle, your work, your family, and your home. As a prophet, you have an office of teaching. You have a responsibility to form yourself and others in the Faith. This is especially true for the family. Parents must teach their children the Faith primarily by living it and showing it to them. As a king, you have the office of governance, so that what is under your care (family, finances, work, etc.) may be used for growing closer to God. Everyone is called to a life of holiness through these offices and fulfilling them will come by living out the four pillars of formation.

Living out the four pillars in daily life comes more from a change in mindset, not as much by adding more things to do. Living out human formation begins with taking healthy care of yourself and your family. Time spent with other families from the parish or the school can help the whole family relax and give the opportunity for community life to flourish. Living out spiritual formation may take a little more work to change as sometimes this means giving up some forms of entertainment that is not healthy for the soul, such as music with crude lyrics or shows and movies with inappropriate content. Use the commute to and from work to pray a rosary or listen to Bible in a Year. Having the family come together for prayer at least once a week, if not every day, teaches the importance of the Faith over other things. And using five minutes of a lunch break for prayer is a way to live your faith in front of others. Intellectual formation could be anything from attending parish adult formation events to watching a ten-minute video from Ascension Press. The idea is to desire to learn more about the God you worship, not to get a doctorate. Finally, pastoral formation can be lived out both at home and at work. Your interactions with family and coworkers should be made in a way that the joy of your faith will shine forth to others. When they see that joy and desire it, that's the beginning of evangelization.

Live out the offices of your baptism. Heaven is not earned by merely attending Sunday Mass. It is a gift given by God's love and received through your love of Him and of your neighbor. Our Lord's new commandment was to *love one another*. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. (Jn 13:34) The love of Christ was shown by His communion with the disciples, His life of prayer to the Father, His teaching and healing of the people, and His sacrifice on the Cross. Live out this commandment and strive to be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect. (Mt 5:48) Then you too will be made after His own heart.
