

Gospel Additation September 8, 2024 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time — and her own, too — and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling down.

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "Ephphata!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's perfect love.



Unexpected Healing at the National Eucharistic Congress

I am so thankful for the opportunity to attend the National Eucharistic Congress last month in Indianapolis. This pilgrimage was one that I needed more than I realized. The past 12 months have been an uphill challenge for me. I was diagnosed with recurrent pericarditis of the heart in July of 2023 and have been undergoing treatments since. Extreme fatigue, shortness of breath, and chest pain present challenges daily. I am a wife, a mother of four, and a teacher. I felt like everyone was getting a small piece of what I was able to give. I have been in the hospital four times and doctors still do not know why I developed this disease. My most recent stay was just a week before our departure due to an infection I developed. I was not sure if I would be able to attend. Thankfully, I was cleared to depart and packed my bags! There were speakers throughout and opportunities for prayer and adoration with each day consisting of a theme. The theme for the second day was healing. The highlight of this day was a visit to the reliquary chapel. It was in this chapel that I encountered a spiritual moment of healing that I felt was just for me. There was a relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis that I had been looking forward to venerating. I use him often in my teaching at Annunciation Catholic School with my middle school students. We looked closely to see what part of him the relic came from and discovered it was part of his pericardium. I stopped in my tracks sharing with Fr. Chad that this is the exact part of my heart that had been ailing me for over a year. He asked me to kneel so he could pray over me. I closed my eyes and pictured this amazing saint to be interceding for me with our request. At that moment I experienced immediate spiritual healing. My shoulders fell and I sobbed a beautiful cry filled with submission and obedience. I let the weight fall and felt the Lord holding me in his hands. This is the beauty of traveling on pilgrimage with a priest. His hands are consecrated and Jesus is more present than ever.

I realized as Father prayed over me that I have been praying only for physical healing. We know that not everything we pray for comes to us in the time we want, especially healing. When we are in pain and experiencing suffering it is natural to want someone to take it away. My prayers were rather impatient. "Please help me. Don't you see I'm trying to do your work as a wife, mother, and teacher? I'm so tired and I have very little left to give" I would recover and then find myself back in the hospital again filled with worry about mounting medical bills and time away from work and my family. I really didn't feel like the Lord was listening to me. This is what is so hard about prayer. We have to submit to His will. We say, "Thy will be done" in the Our Father and if we are trying to tell God how and when to heal us that is not going to work.

It's THY will be done, not MY will be done. When it comes to prayer, we have to look at the bigger picture. Is the Lord trying to teach us something through illness? Could it be that something good can come from suffering? He wants us to approach Him with a humble heart and I had not been doing that. As I walked in the Eucharistic Procession several days after my experience with the relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis I was able to keep up with the group with greater ease. I am truly hoping that a full physical recovery is in my future. It may not be immediate, but I know God has a plan for me and he will be with me each and every day. If healing is not the will of our Father for me, I will not look at it as a curse or a burden. Instead, I have pledged to find the gifts and to tie any suffering to Jesus on the cross. That is what the Lord asks us to do, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it." Matthew 26 24-26. Glory to Jesus Christ!
