




30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, "Master, let me receive my sight." Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

EVANGELICAL COUNSEL OF VOLUNTARY OBEDIENCE

"Here of am, of have come to do your will" (Heb 10:9)

The members of the consecrated life take vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience during their perpetual profession. From previous discussions, we have considered the vows of chastity and poverty. We are concluding our discussions with the vow of obedience. The Code of Canon Law defines the evangelical counsel of obedience, to be undertaken in the spirit of faith and love in following Christ, who was obedient even unto death, and requires a submission of one's will to lawful Superiors, who act in the place of God when they give commands in accordance to the institute's constitutions (Can 601). Since religious life focuses on the imitation of Christ, the three evangelical counsels reflect Christ. Although the evangelical counsels are closely related, the practice of one vow becomes a stepping stone to being faithful to the other two vows.

The practice of obedience has its roots in the Bible. Throughout the Old and the New Testaments, figures such as Abraham, Moses, and the Apostles exemplify a life of obedience to God's call. The encounter between the visit of Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary and Joseph are phenomenal events that demonstrate the act of total submission of one's will to God. Mary simply confessed: "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to your words" (Lk 1:38). Joseph, for his part, surrendered his will to follow the message of the angel who came to him in a dream.

Through the vow of obedience, religious men and women offer and surrender their will as a sacrifice to God, by uniting themselves more permanently and securely with God's saving Will. They followed the example of Jesus Christ, who came to accomplish his Father's Will (Jn 4:34, 5:30; Heb 10:7; Ps 39:9). The Religious are moved by the Holy Spirit to subject themselves in faith to those who hold God's place as their superiors. The Superiors are first among equals, appointed to serve their brothers and sisters in the spirit of Christ, who ministered to His sisters and brothers in submission to the Father, and laid down His life in expiation for many. (Mt 20:28)

At the core of the evangelical counsel of obedience is the call for an individual's submission of his/her will to God and, the Church and its leaders. The submission of one's will should not be seen by superiors as a subjugation of one's right, of blind obedience. Rather, it should be seen as an expression of love and fidelity to God. Since the hallmark of the religious life is lived within the context of living the evangelical counsel, obedience, whether practiced within the community or outside of it, is important for the sake of order and uniformity in the community.

The exercise of authority by superiors is of crucial importance. The Fathers of the Second Vatican Council encourage Superiors to "govern their subjects in the realization that they are children of God and respect them as human persons, fostering in them a spirit of voluntary submission" (Perfectas Caritates 14). Therefore, those in authority are not to lord it over their subjects. Rather, they ought to listen to their subjects and exercise their authority in a spirit of dialogue and charity. They should avoid the secular mentality of abuse of power as "Power tends to corrupt, and absolute power corrupts absolutely."

We live in a contemporary society that is multicultural, and fast becoming secular and individualistic. Freedom in such a society is highly valued and cherished—to the extent that everybody is conscious of his space, rights, and privileges. Obedience is one of the most challenging dimensions of religious life. Most often, some members of the institute are hesitant to surrender their will to their superiors. This leads to insubordination and undue tension. Without obedience, there is bound to be anarchy, as everyone wants to do whatever pleases his/her whims and caprices.

The evangelical counsel of obedience is a daunting task. It is not restricted to the consecrated persons. The clergy also promise obedience and respect to their Bishops and their successors. Obedience is an indispensable virtue. Saul was rejected as king of Israel on account of disobedience. Like Christ, everyone needs to embrace the virtue of obedience as we shall render an account of our stewardship before Christ our Master.




