# LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

#### ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers assist the presider during the celebration of Mass. Some of their active participation includes lighting candles, carrying the crucifix during the processional and recessional, presenting the Sacramentary to the presider for opening and closing prayers, receiving with the presider gifts brought up from the congregation, and assisting during Liturgy of The Eucharist. Altar servers must be in 4th grade or older, and have received the sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

#### ALTAR LINEN MINISTRY

This ministry is responsible for properly laundering the linens used during the Mass celebrations including the albs worn by the priests, deacons, and servers. This includes cleaning, ironing, and folding the linens.

#### **CLEANING GUILD**

Each Thursday, after the 8:15am daily Mass, the cleaning guild is at work. This group spends time together cleaning the church and chapel; keeping these sanctuaries as beautiful as they are. The time commitment is approximately 1 to 2 hours each week.

Ministers of Art and Environment are called to serve the parish in preparing an environment for worship that will mediate the presence of God. The goal is to care for all the elements of worship, ensuring that the total environment is clean, appropriate, authentic, beautiful and accessible.

#### **HOMEBOUND MINISTERS**

Communion Ministers to the Sick and Homebound bring the Body of Christ to those unable to receive in any other manner. These ministers may visit those homebound in their own homes, nursing homes, extended care facilities and hospitals. Proper training is essential and will be provided by the parish staff. One must have a proper understanding and disposition of who Jesus is in the Eucharist.

#### **MASS CAPTAIN**

Mass Captains are responsible for coordinating a full team of Liturgical Ministers to serve at each Mass. The captain coordinates any special instructions or requests with the presider, deacon, and ushers. They set the credence table with the vessels used during the Mass celebration. Mass Captains sign up to "Captain" particular Masses that include weekend, daily, holy days, marriage, and funerals. A Mass Captain must be commissioned as an Extraordinary Minister.

#### SACRISTAN

This ministry serves on Monday morning after daily Mass by cleaning the Sacristy from the previous week and preparing for Masses to be celebrated during the coming week. A proper host count is part of this service.

#### **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS**

These are lay people commissioned by the diocese that help distribute communion during the celebration of Mass. EMs serve at Mass when there is a need, including holy days and feast days. EMs must understand the divine presence of our Lord in the sacred species.

#### **MINISTERS OF THE WORD/LECTORS**

Lectors proclaim the Word of God at Mass and other liturgical services. Lectors are scheduled for all Masses including weekend, seasonal, holy days of obligation, daily Masses, and special liturgies. Training, leading to certification, is required and provided. Lectors must be age 16 or older and have received the sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

#### **USHERS & GREETERS**

Ushers and Greeters are the first to welcome parishioners and visitors into our church. Ushers are friendly, courteous, and able to answer any questions that people might have. Duties include meeting and greeting, taking up the collection, assigning gift bearers, helping to facilitate the communion procession and cleaning after Mass. In the event of a medical emergency, ushers will be first to respond and get medical help.

### SACRAMENTS

#### BAPTISM

This ministry assists the deacons in preparing for the baptismal service, including setting out items for the baptism itself. For infant baptism, please contact the parish office to register at the parish and sign up to attend a baptismal preparation class prior to scheduling.

#### FIRST RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION): AGES 6-12

Your child will participate in a minimum of two years of sacramental preparation prior to receiving the Sacrament of First Reconciliation. Children prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation through Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (Level 2). As part of the preparation, parents will attend four, Friday evening Parent/Child Meditation Nights to be held in February and March.

#### **CONFIRMATION & FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: AGES 8-12**

Confirmation and 1st Holy Eucharist are received together. Your child will participate in a minimum of two years of sacramental preparation prior to receiving these sacraments.

As part of preparation, parents will attend a Spring Retreat with their child. Parents are also required to participate in a minimum of one of the faith formation opportunities offered at St.Gabriel.

St. Gabriel Parish Marriage Preparation Program coordinates all the steps necessary for a couple to prepare for a lifetime of marriage with God at the center. The program is a 9–12month process which includes diocesan courses and parish prep. Couples who are civilly married are invited to convalidate their marriage and receive the graces that accompany the Sacrament of Matrimony.

The process begins with an introductory meeting with the Director of RCIA and continues with weekly classes on Tuesday evenings.

## FAITH FORMATION

#### CHILD FAITH FORMATION CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD: AGES 3-12

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd was developed by Sofia Cavaletti in collaboration with Gianna Gobbi, based on the two pillars of Sacred Scripture and Sacred Liturgy, and on the Montessori principles of human development and respect for the dignity of every soul. Children in CGS receive formation in a specially prepared environment called an atrium; a sacred, "hands on" retreat-like space where catechists and children hear, ponder, pray, and celebrate the most essential mysteries of our faith as revealed in Sacred Scripture and Liturgy.

CGS Level One: 3 yrs. old – Kindergarten CGS Level Two: 1st grade – 3rd grade (Level Two includes 1st Reconciliation Prep) CGS Level Three: 4th and 5th grade (Level Three includes delayed Sacrament Prep)

#### **POST-SACRAMENT FAITH FORMATION: AGES 9-12**

4th & 5th graders who have received all their Sacraments of Initiation continue their faith formation through Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level 3: Mystagogy. Level 3 focuses on God's plan to join all people together. Children are posed the question, "What is my place in the Kingdom of God?" Older children are now ready to prayerfully begin Scripture typology in depth and to become intimately familiar with the prayers of the Roman Missal. In Level 3 children are ready to enter more intentionally into cultivating a life of virtue.


